11.	Course objectives (competences) and learning outcomes:	After attending theoretical classes, passing the colloquiums and held practical exercises, the student should: be able to perform an examination, assess the psychological type of the patient and determine a treatment plan; know the growth and development in the orofacial region, know the chronology of dentition in children, and diagnose orthodontic irregularities of the orofacial system; diagnose and treat caries in primary and permanent teeth; diagnose and treat diseases of the pulp and periodontal, soft tissues in the mouth, know how to select and apply adequate dental material in accordance with the indication; plan and perform oral surgical interventions in children; diagnose and treat trauma and complications of trauma in children; plan and perform aesthetic procedures in children. The student should be ready to practice interdisciplinary cooperation with the interrelated different dental fields during the care of the patient in a dental office. - Objectives of the Course Program Orthodontics (Competences): Introducing students to methods used to secure optimal conditions to develop normal occlusion, ranging from pregnancy to the development of permanent dentition. Early diagnosis of the possible development of orthodontic abnormalities and taking interceptive measures to prevent further development of orthodontic irregularities.

Chapter - Department of Pediatric and Preventive Dentistry (8 classes) - Admission of a child in a dental office of dental work with children (division of children into age groups and by behavior, working with non-cooperating children, determining individual caries profile (Activity) and predisposition to orthodontic irregularities and other oral diseases, caries risk, medical and photo documentation - 2 classes Primary teeth - features, chronology of sprouting, diagnosis and therapy of dental caries of milk teeth and complications (endodontic treatment), early childhood caries (etiology, prevention and therapy) - 1 class Young permanent teeth - characteristics, diagnosis, and therapy of caries and endodontic treatment of young permanent teeth. - 1 class Traumatic tooth injuries and supporting tissues - division of traumatic injuries, diagnosis, RTG findings, first aid, and therapy. - 2 classes Oral-surgical interventions in childhood - 1 class Materials in pediatric dentistry: agents for cavity cleaning, materials for temporary cavity sealing, bases, liners, materials for definitive root canal obturation, restorative materials (composites, glass ionomer cements, hybrid materials) - 1 class Chapter 1 Learning outcomes: Students acquire theoretical knowledge of working with children, assessing the individual caries profile and applying preventive measures, treating caries and complications of primary caries, treating caries and complications of young permanent and permanent teeth, Extraction of primary and permanent teeth, and materials applied to Pediatric dentistry. Practical teaching - exercises After passing the entrance colloquium, during the semester, under the supervision of Teacher in charges, the students are obligated to complete a complete remediation of teeth and soft diseases of at least two patients (preferably with mixed dentition) and to prepare medical and photo documentation for the work, which represents a condition for getting a signature. 2. They will be introduced to how they will educate parents about their children's oral health care, the application of myofunctional exercises, the timely removal of bad habits, and improperly performing orofacial functions. They will get acquainted with the types of orthodontic aids for an early interceptive treatment. Practical teaching - exercises After passing the entrance colloquium, during the semester, under the supervision of the teacher in charge, the students are obligated to make interceptive orthodontic aids in at least two patients in an early mixed dentition, and to prepare a complete orthodontic documentation for the developmental anomaly. To apply myofunctional exercises, selective grinding, space maintainer, and inclined plane.
